





The Rietveld / Sandberg Library has around 11,000 books available for students and alumni. In recent years the collection has been updated, while also adopting the library collections of SKOR (Foundation for Art in Public Space) and museum De Paviljoens. The collection spans different categories such as philosophy, art history, artist monograph and specialist fields (photography, architecture, graphic design, fashion, etc.).

> In addition to building up and maintaining the book collection, the library focuses on generating knowledge and stimulating research by organising a range of activities in the library, including exhibitions, lectures and reading groups.

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The Library is housed in the basement of the FedLev building, in an interior designed by the British artist Nils Norman.



An elusive

documenta is a phantom of sorts. the scheduled opening dates, with a multitude of actors joining to constitute what we have been referring to as the public dimension of the project, documenta 14 is comprised of its making, its experience, its discussion, and its possible continuations. We see documenta 14, therefore, as exactly the acts that can be carried out by anyone and everyone as a diverse, ever-changing, transnational, and anti-identitarian parliament of bodies—of all bodies coming together in documenta 14, to then disperse and form other parliaments, other instances of destituent power, elsewhere and in another time.


Art is a physical as much as it is a mental experience-it is not an abstract demonstration of conditions that can be deployed in any context. Contrary to the illusions of global accessibility and undistinguishable sameness of being that we are induced to believe by the marketing strategies of global capital and optimistic narrations of failing mainstream politics, the place and the time matter. Nevertheless, at the same time, we are experiencing painfully limited mobility and drastic restrictions of individual freedoms. In such a context, it makes sense to initiate the fourteenth iteration of documenta by moving it from its location on the margins of the European economic power center to the city that was once one of the central meeting points of the Mediterranean world, and, with it, the proverbial cradle of that same European civilization that has reached its present state of exhaustion. Even in the midst of what many see as a downfall, heralding the imminent fate of other countries in the hitherto prosperous West, Athens, located forever between cultures, connecting three continents and holding multitudes, remains the nexus of challenges and transformations that the entire continent is now experiencing. Thus it seemed most pertinent to work and act from Athens, where we might begin to learn how to see


The main book of documenta 14 takes the form of a reader, evoking the various meanings associated with the term. The documenta 14 Reader explores—in essay, allegory, poem, historical legal document, and hybrid literary other-the discursive and practical concerns of the project, such as debt and gift, the coloniality of power, economies of the exhibition. and languages (and other currencies) without remainder. A critical anthology that reflects on history in order to better envision the present and reconceptualize the future, the Reader features both newly commissioned and foundational texts as well as image portfolios that illustrate the expansive scope-at once temporal and geographic-of historical artists and actors included in the documenta 14 project. 














GYMNASIUM
